A World Difference

During spring break of 2024 I went to Jamaica with my church. This Mission trip was something that I'd been praying about since the beginning of my school year. My parents had gone 2 years prior to this. I thought I knew what was going on. I knew that it was going to be difficult to see some of the conditions that people were living in. I knew that the people there didn't have even half of the resources the states have. What I didn't know, or prepare myself for, was how grateful these people are. They live their lives with such optimism! Most are dirt poor, with little money and little valuable possessions in our eyes. In their eyes it'll get better. Things could never look up for them, yet they are appreciative of the small things. Everyone is like that there. Even the kids! I will never forget the faces of those kids at schools we went to when we told them we had sweeties. They lit up! Here, we look at a piece of candy and say "Where's the rest," we don't say thank you, we don't appreciate it. I know that I have never been so grateful for a little sweetie that I jumped for joy, or ran to tell everyone I knew that I had a piece of candy. We take for granted so many things! We cooked the kids breakfast and they were SO excited! I have never gotten that excited for breakfast. It made me think about so many things that are a privilege that not everyone has. I had no idea how much those kids would have an effect on me. They made me look at certain things so much differently, I now know that what I have is something that not everyone has. I've always known that, but to see is a completely different experience.





We went there with a mission of making disciples. We also went there to build a house for a guy named Joseph. He was living in tin put together. Their definition of poverty and ours are completely different. Yes, we have poverty, people struggle everywhere. Almost all the houses in this area look similar to this. They live in poverty, whereas we have people here and there that are living like this here. What we built was a simple house, it had one room with a bed, and he had a couple housewarming things. But it had a roof that won't fall over him. That's a privilege many of us take for granted.



The schools were one of my favorite places to be! I think it's crazy

that they don't have half of the resources we do, but they do more than we have ever done. They relate everything back to God and I think that's amazing. They recite verses every morning, and they know them too! I wish our schools had that. I'm now trying to do more in my own school. All thanks to them.

Delbert loved the Razorbacks, attending football games in Little Rock and Fayetteville. He and Ruby spent many years supporting the Hogs with fellow church members, Wendell & Flo Leckbee, and John & Lou Williams. Delbert was also an avid fisherman, enjoying time with his Pastor and friend, Ben Scott, then in later years, Bill Book. One time, out in a boat with his soon to be son-in-law David, Delbert ran up over a stump and threw him over the top of the boat. David was wearing heavy overalls and boots. Arkansas FWB Women's Ministry Scholarship

Scholarship Information

Arkansas FWB Women's Ministry provides educational scholarships as part of its ongoing mission: helping Free Will Baptist women discover and utilize their God-designed roles for communicating the Gospel.

Eligibility

- 1. Must be a Female student.
- 2. Must be an active member of a Free Will Baptist Church in good standing with the Arkansas State Association.
- 3. Must be enrolled in a Free Will Baptist College.
- 4. Must be considered a full-time student with a minimum of 12 hours per semester.
- 5. Must maintain a minimum grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 or above.
- 6. Must submit a completed application and all required documentation by the specified deadline. (June 21, 2024)

Application Process

- 1. Submit the application
- 2. Provide a written statement of your testimony and conversion experience
- 3. Provide three letters of recommendation-one must be from your pastor or youth pastor (no family). Letters must be mailed directly to the address below.
- 4. Submit a statement of financial need
- 5. Provide verification of enrollment in a Free Will Baptist College (acceptance letter)
- 6. Provide verification of GPA (copy of current transcript)

Awards

- 1. The scholarship amount will be dependent on available funds, and awarded ½ Fall Semester and ½ Spring Semester.
- 2. The scholarship award will be payable to the educational institution.
- 3. The scholarship award will be for one year and the recipient must re-apply for each year of eligibility.
