Arkansas State Meeting Highlights

The 2023 State Meeting was highlighted by its theme: "Heaven." Arkansas pastors Tim Forman (First Star City), Daniel Young (Mt. Bethel), and Tim Campbell (First Walnut Ridge) developed the John 14:1-6 text with "A Prepared Place," "A Prepared Path," and "A Prepared People." Michael Breshears (Nashville, TN) lead the music in the three worship services. Moderator Tim Landers skillfully guided the association through worship, fellowship, and business.

Attendance continues to edge back to pre-covid numbers as 163 were in attendance, which included 52 ministers, seven deacons, and five missionaries.

Reports were heard from the five state ministries, along with most of our national agencies and a few partnerships. The state board members and officers elected to serve for the 2023-24 year can be found on page seven of this issue. A 2024 State Cooperative budget of \$600,000 was approved.

Worship Tracks for Hymns

There is a new option available for churches with limited musical leadership to be able to sing the hymns they love. Doug Little has just released Favorite Hymns Worship Tracks Volumes 1-4 and Favorite Hymns of Invitation Volume 1.

Favorite Hymns Worship Tracks feature the following:

- Audio recording of the hymn with song leader singing or without the voice, with simple accompaniment and harmonies as found in the hymn book
- Video synchronized with the audio that automatically projects lyric slides No copyright or licensing concerns, as all songs are Public Domain
- No Internet connection required
- Consistent format and layout of lyrics among the sets Affordable cost: Each set of 10 hymns is \$25.00 if downloaded digitally.
- Format options: Files are MP4 format; they can be downloaded digitally or can be sent on a thumb drive if preferred (\$5.00 additional cost).
- Long-term value: The files will belong to the purchaser to use repeatedly.
- Can use as audio-only if video projection isn't desired. Folks can sing along right from the hymn book rather than a screen.
- Consulting with Doug if desired to help use them effectively
- Multiple uses: congregational singing, fellowship gatherings, nursing home services, shut-in visitation anywhere folks would like to hear or sing a hymn


